

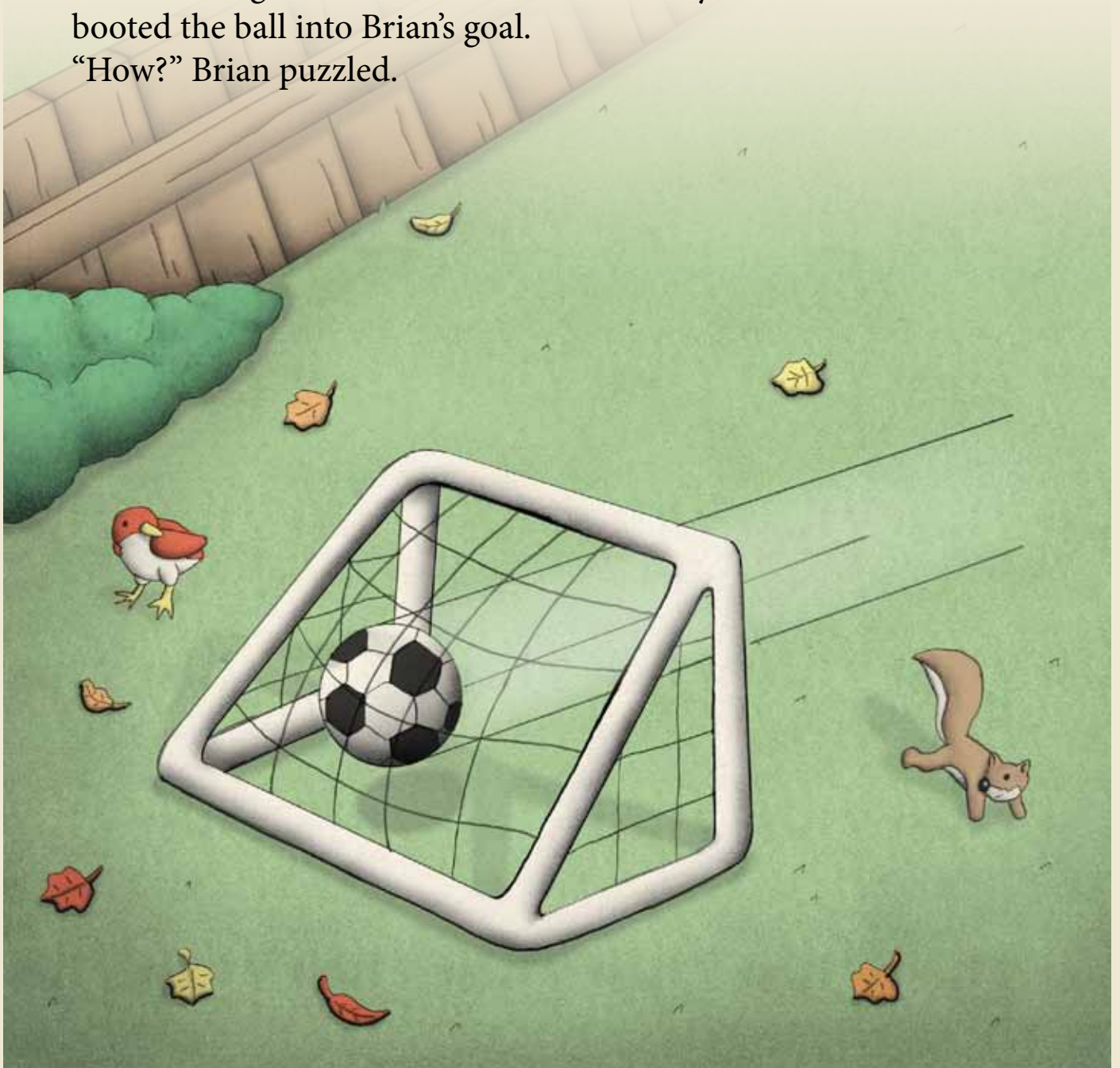



One sunny afternoon, Brian and Lisa were having fun playing a game of soccer. Brian tried to get the ball from Lisa, but her feet were too fast.
